Program requirements and notes

In order to graduate you must:

- Successfully complete 384 units as outlined in the Program Structure
- Complete a minimum of 80 days Supervised Professional Experience, completed as full-time blocks, most of which must be completed in Queensland schools
- Successfully complete the Literacy and Numeracy Test for Initial Teacher Education students. For more information on this Government initiative please visit the Students First website. Further information on the test, including sample test questions and registration information, please visit the Australian Council of Educational Research website
- · AITSL require a minimum of four courses chosen for a minor teaching area, with no more than two introductory courses.
- Professional Experience courses (EDU328, EDU424, EDU426) should not be completed in the same semester as a course from a major or extended minor. All courses studied concurrently with a Professional Experience course should be EDU coded

- The following combinations of teaching areas will take longer than four years to complete and students will need an additional semester to finish.
- · Psychological Sciences Extended Minor combined with any of the majors;
- Biological Sciences Extended Minor combined with any of the majors, for students commencing in Semester 2;
- Biological Sciences Major combined with the Chemical Sciences Extended Minor, for students commencing in Semester 2.

These combinations are NOT available for international students

- The Psychological Sciences Extended Minor is only available for students admitted in the program in Semester 1
- Completing this program within the specified (full-time) duration is based on studying 48 unit points per semester (normally 4 courses) and following the recommended study sequence
- The unit value of all courses is 12 units unless otherwise specified
- It is each students responsibility to enrol correctly according to your course requisites, program rules and requirements and be aware of the academic calendar dates
- Cross-institutional study is not permitted for the education (EDU) coded courses and SCS203 Introduction to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Education in the Bachelor of Education (Secondary) / Bachelor of Science

- Courses within this program are assessed using a variety of assessment methods which may include essays, seminar presentations, reports, in-class tests and examinations
- Only a full-time study option is available to international students on a Student Visa

WIL notes

In order to commence Supervised Professional Experience (SPE) placement you must:

- Obtain a Blue Card (or link your existing Blue Card to USC) prior to commencing supervised professional experience. Applications should be submitted at least 12 weeks prior to the SPE start date. View the Blue Card Fact Sheet for further information
- Complete PrePlace and a Student Placement Agreement (further information will be provided by the placement office upon enrolment)
- Be willing to travel to attend supervised professional experience placements
- Visit Education Professional Experience (PEx) for more information on requirements for placement.
- It is no longer a requirement that students in Bachelor of Education/Bachelor of Science are fully vaccinated against COVID-19.

Please note that some placement host organisations have chosen to continue requiring COVID-19 vaccination. If you are not fully vaccinated, it is important to know that placement opportunities in your program may be limited and may result in a delay to your placement.
