In order to graduate you must:

- Complete 80 days of Supervised Professional Experience
- Successfully complete the Literacy and Numeracy Test for Initial Teacher Education students. Further information on the test, including sample test questions and registration information, please visit the Australian Council of Educational Research website.

To commence supervised professional experience (SPE) you must:

- Obtain a Blue Card (or link your existing Blue Card to USC) prior to commencing supervised professional experience. Applications should be submitted at least 12 weeks prior to the SPE start date. View the Blue Card Fact Sheet for further information.
- Complete PrePlace and a Student Placement Agreement (further information will be provided by the placement office upon enrolment)
- Be willing to travel to attend supervised professional experience placements
- Visit Education Supervised Professional Experience (SPE) for more information regarding requirements for placements

Program notes

- EDU415MUST be studied in your final semester of study with your final Professional Experience
- Cross-institutional study is not permitted for the Bachelor of Primary Education
- Completing this program within the specified (full-time) duration is based on studying 48 unit points per semester (normally 4 courses) and following the recommended study sequence
- The unit value of all courses is 12 units unless otherwise specified
- It is each students responsibility to enrol correctly according to your course requisites, program rules and requirements and be aware of the academic calendar dates

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- Courses within this program are assessed using a variety of assessment methods which may include essays, seminar presentations, reports, in-class tests and examinations
- Only a full-time study option is available to international students on a Student Visa
- The Study Overseas Program is not available to Primary Education students

- Students can choose between English or Science subject focus courses in Years 2 and 3 of their program
