Program and Dates

EAS is an eight-week informal course available only to USC international student visa students from non-English speaking backgrounds in their 1st semester or session of their degree who are studying in an Award program, Study Abroad, Exchange or Tertiary Preparation Program.

EAS is specifically designed for students with minimum entry level English skills. It is not designed to support students at higher proficiency levels. EAS is provided at no extra cost and is delivered on campus by USC International.

Eligibility Criteria

To participate in this program you must be:

- a USC International student;
- from a Non-English speaking background;
- in your first Semester/Session of an Award program, Study Abroad, Exchange or Tertiary Preparation program or
- in any semester of study if you are enrolled in the Bachelor of Occupational Therapy, Bachelor of Nursing Science, Bachelor of Nursing Science: Graduate Entry, or any Teacher Education program. Students in these specific programs have access to EAS in any semester in recognition of the registration requirements, relating to English language proficiency, of the relevant professional bodies
