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Program requirements and notes

In order to graduate you must:

- Successfully complete 384 units as outlined in the Program Structure
- Complete 80 days of supervised professional experience, completed as full-time blocks, most of which must be completed in Queensland schools.
- Successfully complete the Literacy and Numeracy Test for Initial Teacher Education students. Further information on the test, including sample test questions and registration information, please visit the Australian Council of Educational Research website
- Professional Experience courses (EDU328, EDU424, EDU426) should not be completed in the same semester as a course from a major or extended minor. All courses studied concurrently with a Professional Experience course should be EDU coded

Program notes

- The following combinations of teaching areas will take longer than four years to complete and students will need an additional semester to finish. These combinations are NOT available for international students:
 - Japanese Studies Major with any of the extended minors,
 - Japanese Studies Extended Minor and Psychological Sciences Extended Minor with any of the majors,
 - Theatre and Performance Major combined with the Biological Sciences Extended Minor.
- The Japanese Studies Extended Minor and the Psychological Sciences Extended Minor are only available for students admitted in the program in Semester 1.
- Students undertaking Biological Sciences Extended Minor will complete SCI110 as their elective
- Students undertaking Theatre and Performance Major and the English Extended Minor should complete both CMN260 and EGL201 as part of their extended minor
- The Australian Professional Standards (AITSL Australian Institute of Teaching and School Leadership) require a minimum of six courses chosen for a major teaching area, with no more than two introductory courses and a minimum of two graduate courses. AITSL require a minimum of four courses chosen for a minor teaching area, with no more than two introductory courses.
- Completing this program within the specified (full-time) duration is based on studying 48 unit points per semester (normally 4 courses) and following the recommended study sequence
- The unit value of all courses is 12 units unless otherwise specified
- It is each students responsibility to enrol correctly according to your course requisites, program rules and requirements and be aware of the academic calendar dates
- Cross-institutional study is not permitted for the education (EDU) coded courses and SCS203 Introduction to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Education in the Bachelor of Education (Secondary) / Bachelor of Arts
- Each course must count towards one discipline area only. They cannot be used to count towards both teaching discipline areas
- Courses within this program are assessed using a variety of assessment methods which may include essays, seminar presentations, reports, in-class tests and examinations
- Only a full-time study option is available to international students on a Student Visa
- Refer to the Managing your progression page for help in understanding your program structure, reviewing your progress and planning remaining courses.

WIL notes

In order to commence Supervised Professional Experience placement you must:

- Obtain a Blue Card (or link your existing Blue Card to USC) prior to commencing supervised professional experience. Applications should be submitted at least 12 weeks prior to the SPE start date. View the Blue Card Fact Sheet for further information.
- Complete PrePlace and a Student Placement Agreement (further information will be provided by the placement office upon enrolment)
- · Be willing to travel to attend supervised professional experience placements

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- Visit Education Professional Experience (PEx) for more information regarding requirements for placements
